CALL FOR LOCAL COMPETITORS IN SCRIPPS NATIONAL SPELLING BEE Enrollment deadline is Friday, December 31, 2021

Top Spellers to compete in national competition in Washington, D.C.

The New Orleans (LA) Chapter of The Links, Incorporated invites eligible students in the fourth through eighth grades to participate in the local competition for the Scripps National Spelling Bee Program. The 33rd Annual New Orleans Spelling Bee is tentatively scheduled for March 19, 2022. Students from public and non-public schools from a seven-parish area, including home-schooled students are eligible to participate. Each school can enter up to ten (10) spellers and a speller must not have been a previous final winner in the local bee. The winner will receive an all expense-paid trip to Washington, D.C. to compete in the 2022 Scripps National Spelling Bee. Prizes will be awarded to the top three spellers, including reference books, gift certificates and a trophy.

In order for students to participate in the local spelling bee, they must do so through their school and each school must enroll with the Scripps National Spelling Bee at **www.spellingbee.com**. There is a \$175 enrollment fee (per school) and the final enrollment date is December 31, 2021.

Local spelling bee winner **Zaila Avant-garde**, the first-place winner of its local competition of the 32nd Annual **Scripps National Spelling Bee**, won the **2021 national competition**. Zaila, Speller #133, was an 8th grader at Clover Lane Home School. Zaila participated in the national bee on Thursday, July 8, 2021, alongside ten other contestants. Zaila correctly spelled "Murraya", a type of tree, to win the competition. The final round of this year's Bee was hosted in person at the ESPN Wide World of Sports Complex at the Walt Disney World Resort and aired on ESPN and spellingbee.com. **Zaila is the first African-American and first Louisianian to win the national bee.** She is the first homeschooler to win since 2000.

Zaila's journey to the championship began when she participated in the chapter's local spelling bee, along with 59 other students, which was held on Friday, March 12, 2021 via virtual platform. Zaila participated in a preliminary round, along with 208 spellers on Saturday, June 12, 2021. She advanced to the quarter final round, which was held on Tuesday, June 15, 2021 along with 73 other students. From there, she advanced to the semifinal round, along with 29 students, which was held on Sunday, June 27, 2021. Zaila correctly spelled 'solidungulate,' which means 'having a single hoof on each foot' to advance to the finals. Zaila and her parents have expressed gratitude to the chapter for hosting the spelling bee.
