Chapter awards \$20,000 in scholarships to local students

(New Orleans, LA) -- The New Orleans (LA) Chapter of The Links, Incorporated awarded \$20,000 in scholarships to high school and Historically Black College and University (HBCU) scholars at its annual Swing Into Spring event.

HBCU Scholarship awardees are:

ASHTON BRODEN attends Xavier University of Louisiana, majoring in Mass Communication, with a concentration on Multimedia Production. Ashton currently maintains a 4.0 GPA and is a past recipient of The New Orleans Chapter of The Links, Incorporated's scholarship award. He is also the recipient of the Inaugural Walsh Scholarship, and a chosen member of the UNCF Mellon/Mays Undergraduate Research Fellows Program.

YOUMA DIABIRA attends Xavier University majoring in English Education with a Minor in African Diaspora Studies. Youma maintains a 3.8 GPA with plans to become an English teacher. Youma's efforts as a student leader have aided in building and uniting black student unions, and most recently she expanded her advocacy efforts to reproductive justice, as a fellow_-for the 2022-2024 class of the Next Generation Leadership Institute sponsored by *In Our Own Voice*. Youma also serves as a Policy Advisory Fellow for the Institute of Women and Ethnic Studies and is leading a launch for a student-led emergency contraceptive dispensary.

OSCAR POYDRAS attends Southern University of New Orleans, with dual majors in Social Work and Substance Abuse and Addiction Counseling. He maintains a 3.6 GPA. Oscar is the Vice-President of the Southern University at New Orleans Student Government Association and founder of the Knight Ambassadors, a student-led recruitment and support system. He is also a published author and the secondary editor for the SUNO Observer, a member of the Epsilon Nu Chapter of Kappa Alpha Psi, a member of the Students for Prevention and Education of Substance Abuse, a student representative of SUNO's Judicial Affairs Committee, and a Yard Ambassador and Influencer for the Thurgood Marshall College Fund. Oscar is also a musician and previously toured with Trombone Shorty.
