### LOCAL SPELLING BEE WINNERS ANNOUNCED

Top Spellers to compete in national competition in Washington, D.C.

(New Orleans, LA) -- The New Orleans (LA) Chapter of The Links, Incorporated announces the winners of its annual spelling bee competition.

First Place Winner: Matthew Yi

Second Place Winners: Abigail Curtis-Moore and Kailyn Randall

Third Place Winner: Kennedi Rybiskie

The 33rd Annual New Orleans Spelling Bee was held virtually on March 18, 2022. Ninety-three (93) students from nineteen (19) public and non-public schools from a seven-parish area, including home-schooled students participated.

Matthew Yi will receive an all-expense-paid trip to Washington, D.C. to compete in the 2022 Scripps National Spelling Bee. He will also receive a trophy, Webster Dictionary, a lifetime subscription to Rosetta Stone and Scholastic Book Dollars. The second and third places winners will receive a trophy, a Webster Dictionary and Scholastic Book Dollars.

In 2021, the first place winner of the local spelling bee, **Zaila Avant-garde**, won the 32<sup>nd</sup> Annual Scripps National Spelling Bee. Zaila, Speller #133, was an 8<sup>a</sup> grader at Clover Lane Home School. Zaila participated in the national bee on Thursday, July 8, 2021, alongside ten other contestants. Zaila correctly spelled "Murraya", a type of tree, to win the competition. The final round was hosted in person at the ESPN Wide World of Sports Complex at the Walt Disney World Resort and aired on ESPN and spellingbee.com. **Zaila was the first** African-American and first Louisianian to win the national bee. She was the first homeschooler to win since 2000.

Zaila's journey to the championship began when she participated in the chapter's local spelling bee, along with 59 other students, which was held on Friday, March 12, 2021 via virtual platform. Zaila participated in a preliminary round, along with 208 spellers on Saturday, June 12, 2021. She advanced to the quarter final round, which was held on Tuesday, June 15, 2021 along with 73 other students. From there, she advanced to the semifinal round, along with 29 students, which was held on Sunday, June 27, 2021. Zaila correctly spelled 'solidungulate,' which means 'having a single hoof on each foot' to advance to the finals. Zaila and her parents have expressed gratitude to the chapter for hosting the spelling bee.
